WHO CAN ATTEND?

Rising 1st - 12th graders who are grieving the death of a loved one. Campers must plan to attend both days of their assigned camp session. Please note that this is not an overnight retreat.

Rising 6th – 12th graders: July 6 and 7, 9:00 am – 4:30 pm

Rising 1st – 5th graders: July 8 and 9, 9:00 am – 4:30 pm

WHAT HAPPENS AT CAMP CAROUSEL?



Campers connect with other kids their ages who are grieving. This is one of the greatest benefits that we hear about from campers each year! In small groups, campers explore feelings, healthy coping skills, and memories of their loved ones. Camp is a hands-on, engaging experience that supports campers through fun and creative group activities. Our art and music therapists lead some of these sessions, and our amazing group leaders are with their campers each step of the way. Campers will bring home art projects and reminders that will help them continue to share their stories at home.

TELL ME MORE ABOUT TRIAD PARK! HOW WILL MY CAMPER GET THERE?

Triad Park is located in Kernersville, NC. Camp Carousel is based at Woodland Hall, with easy access to walking trails and inviting outdoor areas as well as an air-conditioned, comfortable indoor space. Camp activities begin and end at Trellis Supportive Care each day. Campers and their leaders will be transported to & from the park by a *Holiday Travel* motorcoach (one of campers' favorite parts of the week!).

WHEN AND WHERE IS CAMP CAROUSEL DROP-OFF?

All campers should arrive to Trellis Supportive Care, 101 Hospice Lane in Winston-Salem, NC at 9:00 am. On Hospice Lane, take the second right to enter the Main Entrance. Take an immediate left for the Williams Education & Counseling Center.



WHEN AND WHERE SHOULD I PICK-UP MY CHILD EACH DAY?

Campers will return to Trellis Supportive Care, 101 Hospice Lane in Winston-Salem, NC for a 4:30 pm pick-up. All pick-up persons must be on the camper's approved list that was completed at registration.
