Having a team of professionals and volunteers who come to you, wherever you call home, with compassionate care is reassuring. Combined with added layers of support, beyond medical care, the greatest benefit is peace of mind.

#### KBR Hospice Home

When medical care is too difficult to manage at home without skilled assistance, or when a caregiver needs respite, our KBR Hospice Home is a haven. Patients receive expert care while caregivers can breathe a little easier.

# Specialized Care

Each patient is unique and so is their care. A personalized care plan is created to honor goals and wishes. Likewise, different illnesses have different effects and symptoms. Specialized Cardiac Care, Lung Care, Veteran Care, and Dementia Care programs focus on the unique needs of patients. Developed in partnership with national organizations, these programs utilize best practices in care.

With advanced treatments and therapies provided at home, hospitalizations are greatly reduced, giving patients and families peace of mind and more time to focus on the precious time they have together.

Nearly **one-third** of our hospice patients benefit from the care provided by specialized medical programs.

#### Palliative Care

With the guidance of a palliative care specialist, patients facing serious illness can gain a greater degree of control in their care. Treatment options are discussed, and goals for care are set. Additionally, Palliative Care leads to a better quality of life as pain, nausea, anxiety, and other symptoms are eased. Care is often provided along with curative treatment, and in coordination with your primary physician.

Complementary therapies are a beautiful addition to the expert medical, social, and spiritual care patients receive and can provide a sense of peace and connection that make all the difference.

## Grief Support Services

Grief is a natural response when a loved one dies, and the journey toward healing is different for everyone. Whether in a group or one-on-one sessions, counseling provides an opportunity to share feelings of loneliness, sadness, anger, and anxiety, in the hope of remembering your loved one with less pain.

The support of our grief counselors is available to anyone in the community who has experienced the death of a loved one, regardless of their Trellis connection.

Grief Counselors provided nearly **3,000** individual sessions. Nearly **300** children benefitted from grief counseling. Over **650** individuals attended group counseling sessions.



## Community Outreach

We host an array of community-wide programs because we believe strongly that people can benefit from our offerings. Likewise, it is vital that we create easy access to our programs and services for all people, and our outreach helps to pave the way for that connection.

Some of our community programs include:

- Grief counseling support and education
- Advance care planning
- Training classes designed to boost caregiver confidence
- Coffees and programs for veterans
- Partnering with senior centers
- Participating in such events as Juneteenth, PRIDE Parade, Fiesta, the Karenni Community Fair, King Fest, and the Stokes Stomp

# Community Support

Trellis provided over \$365,000 in charitable hospice care as well as an additional \$445,000 in charitable grief counseling services without cost to community members.


Each member of the Trellis Supportive Care team, whether providing handson-care, raising funds, or supporting the overall operations, is an essential member of our organization.


77% of staff provided patient care and support. 23% served in administrative or operational roles.
