Palliative Care

In some cases, we can make a world of difference by simply talking with you about how to best manage unwanted side effects of treatment and/or the burdens that often accompany an illness. In the simplest terms, we can help ease your pain and symptoms. That is what we call palliative care.

Palliative Care can be as simple as a one-time consultation with our palliative care specialist or a series of visits where the primary goal is to restore your quality of life by easing unpleasant symptoms and giving you the tools and knowledge to maintain an increased level of comfort.

Our palliative care specialist will not only help manage your pain and symptoms, they can be an invaluable resource for emotional support and knowledge about your illness and disease.

Hospice Care

Depending on your prognosis, you may benefit greatly from our compassionate team of caregivers who provide Hospice Care. With Hospice Care, your medical comfort, emotional wellbeing, and even your spiritual and social wellbeing are our primary focus.

With Hospice Care, your care team members will visit with both the patient and family, in your home (wherever you call home) to make sure that you are living the best quality of life possible.

Whether a nurse visits routinely to make sure you are comfortable, or our hospice aid visits to help with personal care such as bathing and shaving, or our chaplain visits to talk through spiritual concerns, you will feel comforted. Your dignity, peace of mind, and ability to embrace each day with hope is our primary reason for being.



What You Can Expect with Our Hospice Care

Trellis Supportive Care

Hospice care is a service provided for persons who have a life-limiting illness with a prognosis of 6 months or less. The goal is to provide comfort measures that minimize or eliminate pain or other symptoms associated with the illness. Hospice care addresses the medical, emotional, social and spiritual aspects of each person and their caregivers.

We offer 4 levels of care depending on your needs

Routine Home Care

Our care is provided wherever you call home, including your personal home, nursing home, and assisted living facility. You will receive routine visits from your team. Hospice Care was founded on the idea that most people prefer to be at home so that is our goal.

2 General In-Patient Care (GIP)

Short-term, around-the-clock care can be provided in our hospice homes or a contracted hospital if you are experiencing a crisis.

Our Kate B. Reynolds Hospice Home is in Winston-Salem.

Your Home Away from Home

Our in-patient facilities provide skilled care when your loved one's pain or symptoms can no longer be managed in the home (general in-patient care.) Respite care can also be provided for up to 5 days.



3 Continuous Care

For patients who qualify for General In-Patient Care but who would rather remain at home, we can provide Continuous Care. Short-term higher level of care can be provided in your home by a dedicated Continuous Care Team in periods of crisis. The goal is to manage pain and symptoms within the comfort of your home.

4 Respite Care

Short-term care, up to five days, provided either at our hospice homes or in an extended care facility. This allows an opportunity for the caregiver to rest and recharge or attend to personal needs.

Our in-patient facilities also provide:

- · Private rooms with a home-like setting
- Visitation at any time
- · Pet visitation
- Family rooms, access to kitchens, sun porches, meditation room and chapel
- Nutritious meals and snacks
- Designated smoking areas
- Residential Care (private pay, up to 6 weeks)



How Is Hospice Paid for?

Hospice services are covered by several different methods.

Medicare Hospice Benefit

Beneficiary must be entitled to Medicare Part A.

Medicaid Hospice Benefit

Must meet eligibility requirements for Medicaid or currently have Medicaid.

Private Insurance

Private insurance outlines whether or not the plan covers hospice care.

Private Pay

For patients without Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance, Hospice fees are based on a sliding scale.

As a non-profit, care is provided for patients regardless of ability to pay, thanks to charitable contributions from the community.

Charitable contributions from the community allow Trellis Supportive Care to provide services for anyone in need of end-of-life care.
